2 General Introduction

The Autel MaxiTPMS TBE200 Examiner (hereinafter referred to as “the tool”) is a laser-enabled tire & brake disc-wear examination tool that provides users with quick and accurate tire-wear measurements along with the ability to measure brake disc wear without having to remove tires. The tool's dual cameras enable users to document tire wear and damage as well as scan Tire Identification Numbers (TINs). You can use the tool on its own or with a compatible Autel diagnostics tablet, such as an ITS600/ITS600 Pro to view and print detailed TPMS reports.

This manual describes the construction and operation of the tool and how it works to test tire & brake disc wear.

2.1 MaxiTPMS TBE200 Examiner

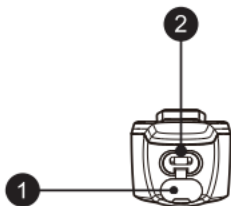


Figure 2-1 Examiner Top View

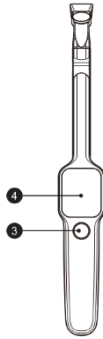


Figure 2-2 Examiner Front View

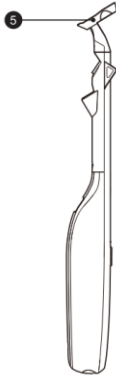


Figure 2-3 Examiner Side View

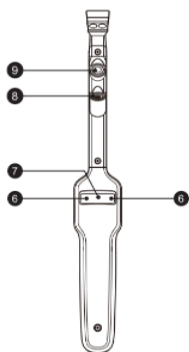


Figure 2-4 Examiner Back View

2.1.2 Power Sources

The tool can receive power from any of the following sources:

- Internal Battery Pack
- AC/DC Power Supply

Internal Battery Pack





The tool can be powered by its internal rechargeable battery, which theoretically, when fully charged can provide sufficient power for about 8 hours of continuous operation.

AC/DC Power Supply

The tool can be powered from a wall socket using its AC/DC power supply. The AC/DC power supply also charges the tool's internal battery.



3 Getting Started

Ensure the tool is connected to the Internet and is sufficiently charged (See [Power Sources](#)). The product should avoid the exposure of direct light, such as sunlight, or close-ranged torch light, and flashlight, during the actual operation of tire tread check, brake disc check, and calibration.

3.1 Power Up

Press and hold the power button on the tool to switch it on. The system will boot up and display the TBE200 Job Menu.

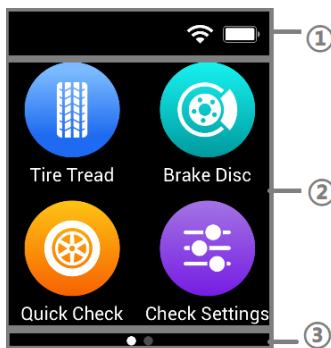


Figure 3-1 TBE200 Job Menu

3.1.3 Locator

The **Locator** icon displays at the bottom of the TBE200 Jobs screen. Swipe the screen left or right to view the previous or next screen.

4 Tire Tread Check

Using laser technology, the Tire Tread application analyzes the wear of the tires on vehicles with no need to remove the tires. Place the tool on the tire, and the tool projects a laser beam. The wear measurement is then sent to the display screen with an accuracy within 0.1mm. Measurements are also displayed graphically.

The Tire Tread application provides two types of checks: “All Treads” and “Single.” When using this application, a message will display prompting user to choose between the current mode the alternative one. You can configure your default check mode under Check Settings. Refer to [Check Settings](#) on page 19 for additional information.

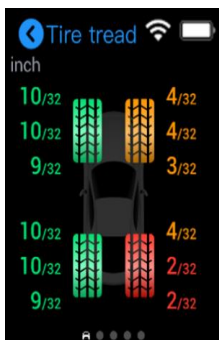






Figure 4-1 Tire Tread Check Screen

4.1 Check modes

There are two check modes available under the Tire Tread application:

Single Check

The **Single Tire** check measures the wear of each tire on the vehicle by examining the tread depth in the center area of the tire only. Unlike the **All Tread** check, the **Single Tire** check only provides one measurement for each tire.

All Tread Check

The **All Tread** check examines your tire wear in three separate areas (outer, center, and inner) for a more comprehensive analysis.

➤ To perform a Tire Tread Check

1. Tap the **Tire Tread** application icon on the Main Job Menu.
2. Select a check mode when prompted.
3. Place the tool on the tire surface and tap the Power/Measure button to start measuring.
4. The measurement will display on the screen.
5. Select a wheel location on the screen, swipe left to view details and scroll down on the details screen to view additional information including tread wear analysis and maintenance suggestions.

NOTE

For optimal measurements, ensure the magnetic head is attached to the tread and that the laser line is perpendicular to the groove being measured.

4.2 Details

The **Details** screen shows a wide variety of tire wear information. After measurements are shown on the screen, select a wheel location, swipe left to view details of the chosen tire. Below are the main sections featured in the **Details** section:

- 1) **Graphic measurements** — shows the measurement data graphically with various colors indicating different degrees of tire wear.
 - The graphic measurements of the **All Tread** check mode displays the wear measurements of three areas of the tire: inner, center, and outer. The **Single** check displays only one measurement for each tire.
- 2) **Braking distance** — displays the stopping distance for the test vehicle based on both the tire tread depth and tire type selected. This section is followed by wear analysis and maintenance suggestions.

The following three tire-related sections are provided in all check modes except for **Brake Disc**:

- 3) **Tire condition** — displays tire status, including normal, worn, bulge, etc.
- 4) **Tire DOT** — scan or manually enter the tire DOT serial number located on the sidewall to acquire basic tire characteristics such as tire recall (American region only) and tire age.
- 5) **Tire specification** — view a series of options and manually enter tire information, including brand, tire model, size, structure type code, etc.

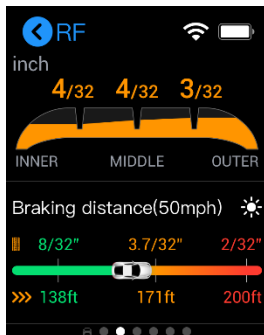


Figure 4-2 Details Screen

5 Brake Disc Check

Your MaxiTPMS TBE200 laser-enabled tool examines brake disc wear quickly and accurately. You can examine the wear status of a brake disc without the need to remove tires. Measurements displayed graphically. The Brake Disc function not only provides brake disc wear measurements, but also offers analysis to ensure driving safety.

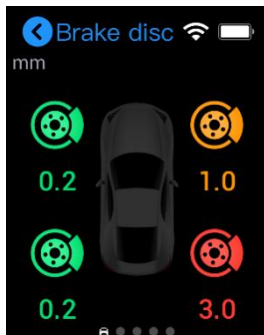






Figure 5-1 Brake Disc Check Screen

5.1 Check mode

Brake Disc Check

The **Brake Disc** function checks for brake disc wear and provides wear analysis. This check mode focuses on brake disc measurements only.

➤ **To perform a Brake Disc Check**

1. Tap the **Brake Disc** application icon on the Main Job Menu.
2. Place the tool on the disc surface and press the Power/Measure button to start measuring.
3. Real-time measurement data will display on the screen with wear status represented by different colors.
4. Select a disc location on the screen, swipe left to view details, and scroll down the screen to view wear analysis.

5.2 Details

The **Details** screen shows information regarding brake disc wear. After measurements are shown on the screen, select a disc location, swipe left to view details of the chosen disc. Below are the main sections featured in the **Details** section:

- 1) **Graphic measurements** — displays the measurements data graphically with by color to indicate disc wear conditions.
- 2) **Wear analysis** — displays service recommendations for disc replacement.

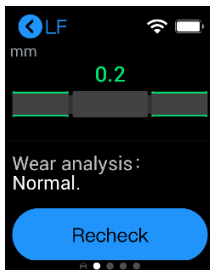


Figure 5-2 Details Screen

6 Quick Check

The **Quick Check** function is specifically designed to measure the tires and brake discs in one session. This mode also provides a comprehensive analysis of tire and brake disc wear.

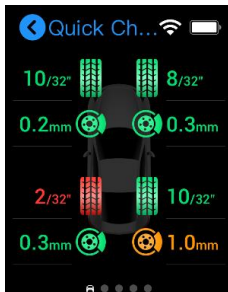










Figure 6-1 Quick Check Screen

6.1 Check mode

Quick Check

The Quick Check function combines the measuring of the tread depth and brake disc wear.

➤ **To perform a Quick Check**

1. Tap the **Quick Check** application icon on the Main Job Menu.
2. Place the tool first on the tire surface, and then on the disc surface, pressing the Power/Measure button to take measurements for each.
3. Real-time measurement data will appear on the screen with wear status illustrated in different colors.
4. Select a wheel or disc location on the screen, swipe left to view details, and scroll down to view additional information including wear analysis and maintenance suggestions.

6.2 Details

The **Details** screen displays additional information related to tire and brake disc wear measurements. After measurements display on the screen, select a wheel or disc location, and swipe left to view details of the chosen tire or disc. Below are the main tire-related sections featured in the **Details** section:

- 1) **Graphic Measurements** — displays the measurement data graphically with various colors indicating different wear conditions.
 - The graphic measurements of **Quick Check** displays wear measurements of tires and brake discs.
- 2) **Braking distance** — displays the stopping distance for the vehicle graphically based on the tire tread depth and tire type. This section is also followed by tire wear analysis and maintenance suggestions.
- 3) **Tire condition** — displays tire status, including normal, worn, bulge, etc.
- 4) **Tire DOT** — scan or manually enter the tire DOT serial number located on the sidewall to acquire basic tire characteristics such as tire recall (American region only) and tire age.

- 5) **Tire specification** — view a series of options and manually enter tire information, including brand, tire model, size, structure type code, etc.
- 6) **Wear analysis** — displays replacement recommendations for tires and brake discs.

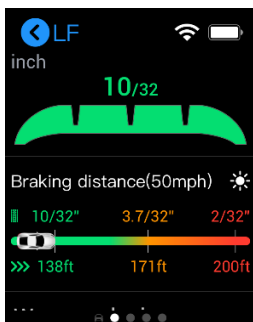


Figure 6-2 Details Screen

7 Check Settings

Tap the **Check Settings** application icon on the Main Job screen, a list of options will display. Adjust these tire-related settings to your preference for optimal **All Tread check** and **Single Check** results.

7.1 Number of tires

The default tire number is four. If the vehicle has six tires, make sure to adjust the **Number of tires** to six before measuring tire tread depth.

7.2 Unit

This option allows you to adjust the measurement units for the tire tread checks. Simply select the appropriate measurement unit, metric or imperial. A check mark will display to the right of the active selection.

7.3 Tire Type

The Tire Type setting is to choose the right type of tire for the vehicle. Three tire types are available, Summer, Winter, and All Season. Select a tire type. A check mark will display to the left of the active selection.

Right beneath each tire option is the tire wear limit with the default value of 1.6–3.2 mm. Tap the arrow icon at the lower-right corner of the tire option bar to change the tread wear limit.

NOTE

When 1.6 mm is left on the tread, it indicates the tire should be replaced immediately. When 3.2 mm is left on the tread, it indicates tire replacement is recommended.

7.4 Tread Check Mode

This option allows you to choose between **Single Check** and **All Tread Check** before initiating a tread check measurement. After choosing the check mode, a check mark will display to the right of the active selection.

7.5 Brake Disc Wear Limit

This option enables you to adjust the brake disc wear limit for brake disc checks. Note that the disc wear limit is always in metric units.

8 Data Query

The **Data Query** function stores the results of the latest measurement session. After the tool is connected with the ITS600/ITS600 Pro tablet, the measurements of the previous session will display on the tablet screen automatically.

Once a new measuring session starts, the previous test results will be replaced by new results.

9 System Calibration

The **System Calibration** application is used to calibrate your examination tool for optimal measuring results.

On the Main Job screen, tap the **Sys. Calibration** icon and place the magnetic head on the calibration table. Press the **Power/Measure** button to start. Wait for 1–2 minutes until calibration is complete.

Calibration is recommended every two months. Immediate calibration should be performed when deviations are detected or when the tool is dropped or mishandled in any manner.

! IMPORTANT

Before the system calibration, keep the magnetic head dry and clean from dirt, dust, water stain, or oil, which may affect the calibration result.

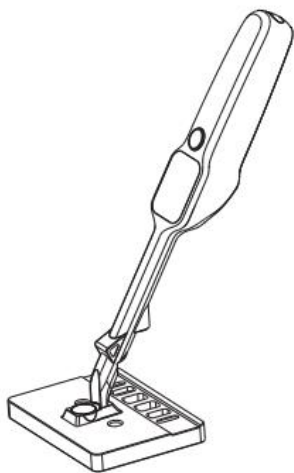


Figure 9-1 System Calibration

10 Settings

Access the **Settings** menu to adjust default settings and view information about the TBE200. The Settings menu includes the following:

10.1 Network connection

This option is for connecting the tool to the Internet. There are two network types available: Wi-Fi and Wi-Fi Direct. Simply swipe the toggle to turn it on.

NOTE

Ensure you turn on both the Wi-Fi and Wi-Fi Direct toggles when pairing the tool with the ITS600/ITS600 Pro tablet for comprehensive inspection reports.

10.2 Brightness

This option allows you to adjust the screen brightness manually. Tap on the brightness icon on the right to brighten the screen and tap the icon on the left to dim the screen.

10.3 Sleep

This option allows you to set the amount of time before your tool goes into “sleep/low-power mode” to conserve battery life. There are three options available for selection (30, 60, and 120 seconds).

10.4 Automatic shutdown

This option allows you to adjust the time (in minutes) before your tool automatically powers off. There are four options available for selection (5, 10, 15, and 20 minutes). After adjusting this setting, a check mark will display to the right of the active selection.

10.5 Language and region

This option allows you to adjust the region for the TBE200. There are 19 regions available. Select the region where you will be using the device. A check mark will display to the right of the selected region.

10.6 About

The About function provides information about the tool, including the manufacturer, model name, serial number, password, firmware version and Wi-Fi MAC.

10.7 Update

The update option displays the latest software updates available for the tool. Before updating the software, ensure the tool's network connection is stable. When a software update is available, a red dot will display atop the **Settings** icon in the upper right corner of the Main Job screen. Tap **Update** to install the software.

NOTE

When updating the software, ensure the tool is connected to the Internet and that its battery is charged to at least 50 percent or is connected to a power outlet.

10.8 Restore factory settings

Restore Factory settings enables you to restore your examination tool to its original factory settings. Once restored, all personal data will be deleted, the wear limit data adjusted, and the initial setup instructions displayed when first used will display.

10.9 Resume animation guide

This option restores animation guides for performing the tire tread check, brake disc check, and system calibration. When **Recovery succeeded** is displayed, the animation guides are provided on the corresponding screens.

11 Maintenance and Service

To ensure that the examination tool performs at its optimum level, we advise that the product maintenance instructions in this section are strictly followed.

11.1 Maintenance Instructions

The following shows how to maintain your tool, together with precautions you should take:

- Use a soft cloth and alcohol or a mild window cleaner to clean the touch screen of the tool.
- Do not use any abrasive cleansers, detergents, or automotive chemicals on the tool.
- Keep the tool in dry conditions and within specified operating temperatures.
- Dry your hands before using the tool. The touch screen may not work if the touch screen is moist, or if you tap the touch screen with wet hands.
- Do not store the tool in humid, dusty or dirty areas.
- Check the housing, wiring, and connectors for dirt and damage before and after each use.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the tool.
- Do not drop or cause severe impact to the tool.
- Use only authorized battery chargers and accessories. Any malfunction or damage caused by the use of unauthorized battery chargers and accessories will void the product warranty.
- Ensure that the battery charger does not come in contact with conductive objects.
- Do not use the tool beside microwave ovens, cordless phones and some medical or scientific instruments to prevent signal interference.

11.2 Troubleshooting Checklist

- A. When the tool does not work properly:

- Make sure the tool has been registered online.
 - Make sure the system software and diagnostic application software are properly updated.
 - Make sure the tool is connected to the Internet.
 - Check all cables, connections, and indicators to see if the signal is being received.
- B. When you cannot turn on the tool:
- Make sure the tool is connected to a power source or the battery is charged.
- C. When you are unable to charge the tool:
- Your charger maybe out of order. Contact your nearest dealer.
 - You may be attempting to use the tool in an overly hot/cold environment. Charge the tool in moderate temperatures.
 - Your tool may have not been connected to the charger properly. Check the connector.
